ACTION GUIDE

<u>Know your Rights:</u> Keep everyone safe. You may want to consider having legal observers at your action. For more info and to download bust cards, check out <u>Green & Black Cross</u> or <u>SCALP in Scotland</u>.

<u>Interactions with police:</u> We strongly advise people not to talk to the police. Police hope to gain 'intelligence' which can put yourself and fellow activists at risk. Please remember police protect the arms trade and disproportionately target black and brown communities. For more info: <u>caat.org.uk/about-</u> <u>caat/how-we-work/action-guidelines/</u>

<u>Keep each other safe:</u> We consider any behaviour which demeans, marginalises, threatens or harms anybody as oppression, and we commit to challenging it. This includes (among many other examples) racism, misogyny, homophobia, transphobia, Islamophobia, antisemitism, and ableism.

<u>Make it inclusive</u>: Platform marginalised voices; support those most affected by police violence; check and communicate accessibility infrastructure in advance. If you need support with this, please do get in touch. We may be able to help fund travel or translation of materials.

<u>Get it in the press:</u> Prepare a press release to send to your local and national newspapers on the day. For more info, please see our PR guide.

<u>Social Media:</u> Make sure you allot someone who can record the event to upload to social media. For more info, see our social media guide

ACTION GUIDE

Ideas for the day:

<u>Banner and Placards:</u> You can hang these up, get a picture of you holding it, or a video with you shouting solidarity with Yemen. Then post on social media (see our socials guide). You can apply to us for banners!

Host a Vigil: Remember those who have died in this brutal conflict. You may want to bring flowers, candles and hold a minute's silence.

<u>Organise a Noise Demo:</u> Make as much noise as possible. You could use pots, pans, instruments, speakers, megaphones, choir, and chants.

<u>Organise a Rally:</u> You can invite speakers to the action. This could be a local MP, activist groups, or members of your community. Make sure to platform the voices of Yemeni communities.

<u>Get creative</u>: This could be something to look at or creative disruption. You could use sculptures, performances, music or costumes to help draw attention to the UK's complicity in Yemen.

<u>Take action from home:</u> If you can't travel, most of these actions can be done in your local community to raise awareness. Or you can take a picture or video with our solidarity with Yemen placard from your home and send it to us or tag us on social media (see our socials guide).
